Delegates from the National Mainstreet Conference will be picked up from the National Wine Centre on **1.30pm on Monday 2nd May**.

If you wish to join the group meet at **Number 2 Hutt Street, corner of East Terrace and Hutt Street at 1.35pm** and join the tour group as they proceed pass the Clipsal 500 race track, along Hutt Street's historic landmarks and on to Beltana House, off Carrington Street, home of artist in residence Cheryl Bridgart.

Continuing along Hutt Street walkers will get a first hand feel of the vibrancy of Hutt street's cafes, restaurants, and shops as Gary and Janice share stories to interest and amuse participants. The walking tour will conclude on South Terrace after a visit to the beautiful Himeji Japanese Gardens.

Delegates will then return to the Wine Centre after a picturesque drive along the Eastern parklands.

The Mainstreet SA National Conference will be held at the National Wine Centre from 1-4 May when traders, councils and mainstreet groups will come together to map a renaissance of shopping strips to fend off the online shopping threat. Delegates will hear from international, national and local speakers.

At 4pm on Tuesday 3rd May our own Tony Williamson will present a session on "Coming in from the Outside".

Anthony Williamson states that with regard to this presentation he has experienced the differences in country town life, city employment and work overseas as a Physiotherapist. Settling and working in Adelaide centred around the comfort factor of Adelaide's size and space. The Hutt Street Precinct known as the 'village in the city' offered the best of both worlds – country friendliness and city amenities. Working as a therapist for 35years in the area, Tony was also involved with developing and exporting medical equipment and training to Asia. His involvement with the Precinct has continued up to the present day in maintaining the 'village' character in conjunction with local commercial and residential development. Added to this his family now has a background in the manufacturing of clothing and fashion retailing within the Precinct main street. It is trusted that his background and views will add to the discussion on mainstreet 'philosophy' and development.
