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DANISH SUCCESS STORY OPENS ITS FIRST RESTAURANT IN AUSTRALIA ... ON HUTT ST

Together with his Australian partner, Tim Burvill, Lars Damgaards and a crew of builders have worked across time zones and language barriers for the last 12 months to create the A Hereford Beefstouw at 143 Street.

It is located in a heritage listed building owned by Chris Diamantis of the Genworth Group, who completely restored it to its original 1850s facade.

Tim Burvill lives and works in the Adelaide Hills with wine as his livelihood, and it was also the wine business that brought him in contact with Lars Damgaard.

Tim owns the successful RockBare winery, and met Lars nearly 10 years ago when Lars came to Australia looking for wine for the restaurants. They not only discovered that they had a mutual love of wine, but also of Hereford cattle.

Lars' restaurants were named after these majestic animals that his parents used to farm and Tim and his wife Sarah farmed Hereford cattle in the Adelaide Hills and upper south-east.

Soon Tim & Sarah were exporting Hereford beef to Denmark, and in 2007 a joint venture company was formed with Lars to buy a large beef cattle farm near Lucindale.

"It was a natural progression for our business to eventually open a restaurant here. I thought that Adelaide would love this kind of restaurant and since our wine and farming operation is based in SA, it seemed crazy to export all of our production to Europe without giving the locals a chance to experience what we do", says Tim Burvill. "Not only are we paddock to plate, we're also grape to glass with many of the wines served in the restaurant made by my wife and I," he quips. "Combined with A Hereford Beefstouw's 40-years experience in running restaurants in Denmark, their strong focus on creating beautiful spaces for their venues, and the quality of our produce, I am confident we have a solid platform to succeed in Adelaide."

The Crown Prince Frederik of Denmark likes to eat a good steak at the A Hereford Beefstouw restaurant in Copenhagen, and I am hopeful that the Royal Couple will dine at our Hutt Street restaurant sometime in the future."

Unique to the Hutt Street restaurant are dry-aged steaks from their own farm. "Our dry-aged beef comes from pure bred Hereford cattle raised on the lush grass pastures of our farm. We hand select our best quality Hereford cattle at approximately 24 months of aged, and dry-age it on the bone for a minimum of 45 days to produce beef with superior flavor and texture," says Burvill. "The beef has a special taste when it has not been vacuum-packed. I can only dream of doing the same in our restaurants in Denmark!"

A Hereford Beefstouw is open 7 days on the corner of Hutt Street and Hume Street. Lunch is from 11.30am to 2pm. Dinner 5.30pm to 10pm. Ring 8232 6868 for bookings. For further information go to www.aherefordbeefstouw.com.au

Volunteers needed for Red Cross Heatwave Service

Telecross REDi is a telephone based service that utilises volunteers to support pre registered clients during a government declared heatwave. The service is available to anybody who may be at risk during a heatwave. During an activation period Red Cross people will be called on to phone pre-registered clients up to three times a day to check on their wellbeing. The purpose of the call is to provide preparation and coping advice that will allow the person to manage themselves throughout an extreme weather event. Red Cross will also enact an emergency procedure if a client is deemed to be in distress.

Red Cross is seeking volunteer callers at their Wakefield Street offices. One hour of training is all that you require to become a caller! You will then be able to assist Red Cross to ensure the well being of approximately 2,500 vulnerable people across the state. During an activation you are able to volunteer for one of three shifts per day.
